

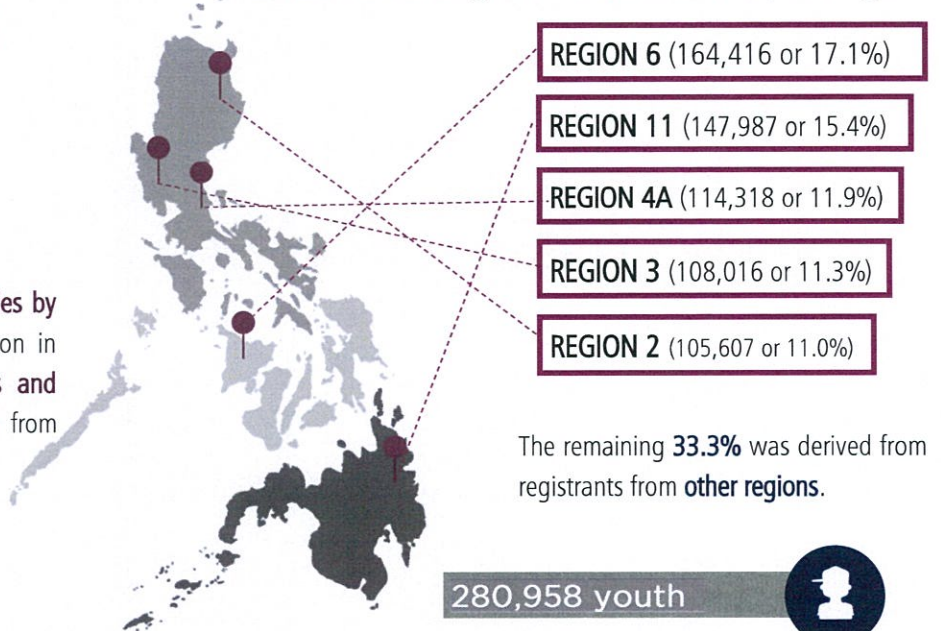

Distribution of Registered Jobseekers per Region



A notable increase on the number of vacancies by **54.2%** was recorded in 2020 from 1 million in 2019. However, the number of jobseekers and employers decreased by **33.9%** and **41.8%** from 1.4 million and 24,998 in 2019, respectively.

The remaining **33.3%** was derived from registrants from **other regions**.

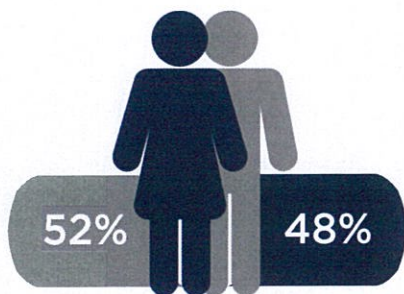
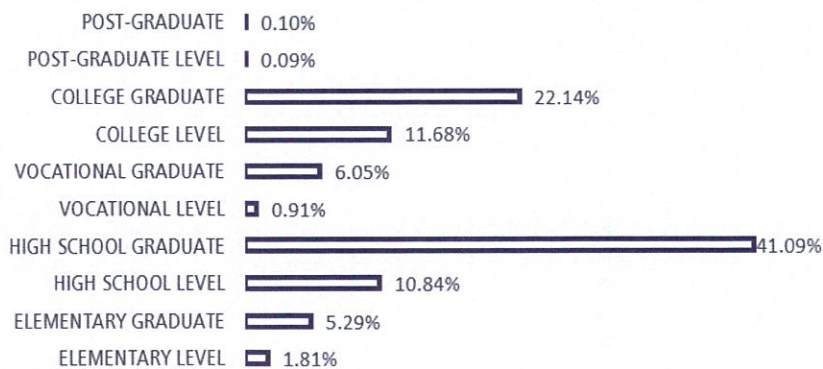


Figure 1. Distribution of Registered Jobseekers by Educational Attainment



High school graduates accounted the largest number of registrants with **379,082 (41.09%)** in 2020 similar in 2019.

Majority of the encoded registrants belonged to the **wage-employed** category under the employed group (21.1% or 202,978) followed by **new entrants/fresh graduates** under the unemployed group (16.8% or 161,397).



The number of youth and senior citizens registered in 2020 **decreased by 51.9%** and **24.2%** from 584,917 and 48,182 in 2019, respectively.

Moreover, the number of registered persons with **disabilities** recorded a steep decrease in 2020 with **73.5%** from the 980 registrants in 2019.

Figure 2. Distribution of Registered Jobseekers by Employment Status

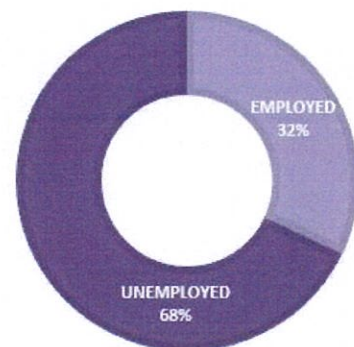

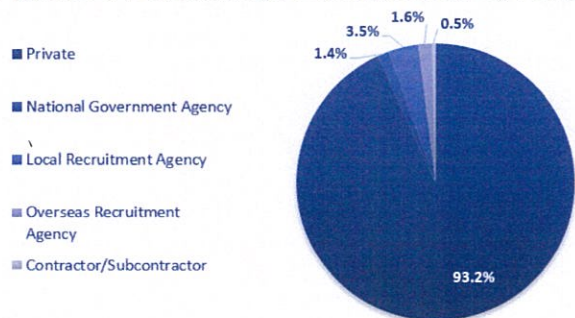

Similar to 2019, majority of the registered establishments were **private employers** (13,542 or 93.2%) followed by **local recruitment agencies** (505 or 3.5%) and **overseas recruitment agencies** (226 or 1.6%).
