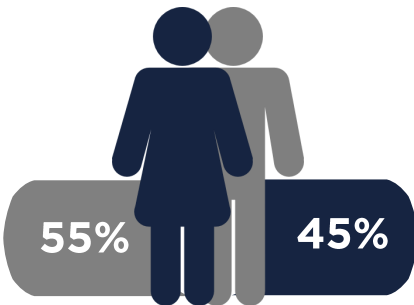


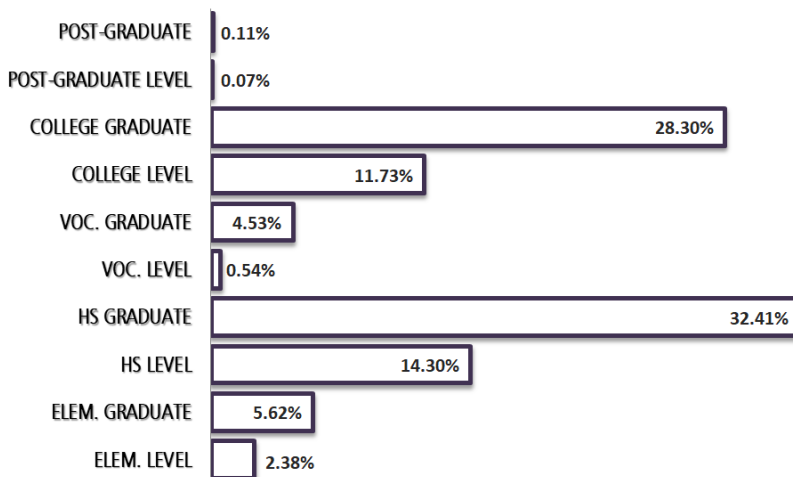

A notable increase on the number of vacancies by **84.8%** was recorded in 2019 from 568,186 in 2018.



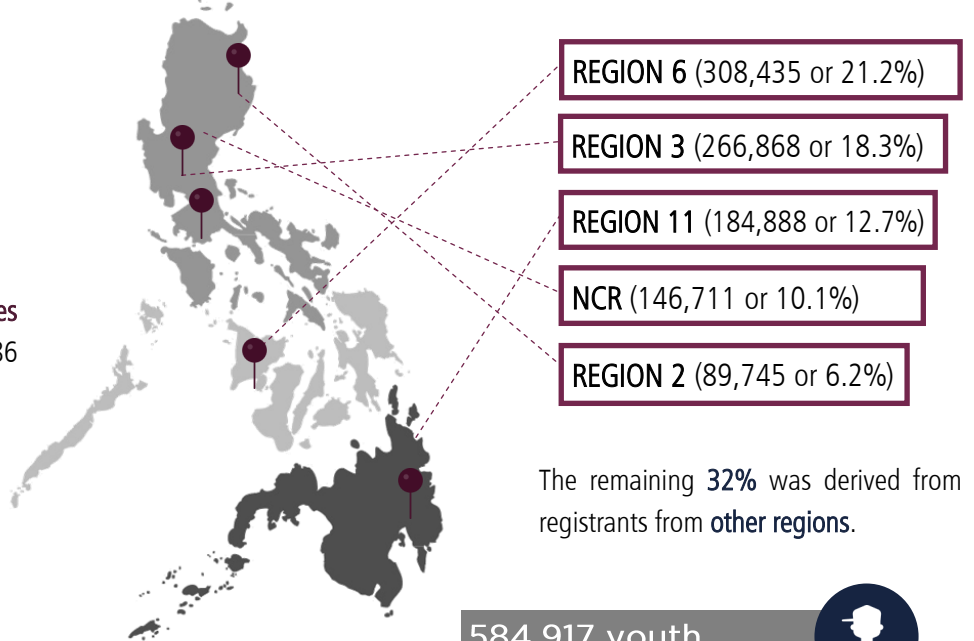
**Figure 1. Distribution of Registered Jobseekers by Educational Attainment**



High school graduates accounted the largest number of registrants with **455,959 (32.4%)** in 2019 as opposed to 2018 wherein college graduates recorded the highest with 262,920 registrations.

Majority of the encoded registrants belonged to the **new entrant/fresh graduate** category under the unemployed group (21.3% or 310,919) followed by **wage-employed** category under the employed group (19.9% or 290,628) similar in 2018.

### Distribution of Registered Jobseekers per Region

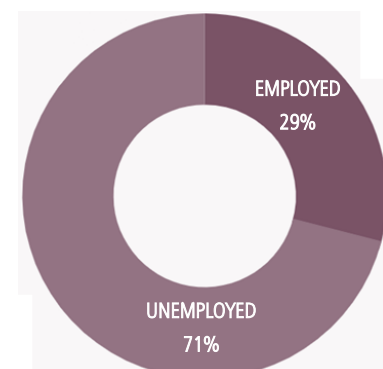


The remaining 32% was derived from registrants from **other regions**.



The number of **senior citizens** registered in 2019 increased by **182%** from 17,088 in 2018. Moreover, a notable increase by **454%** on the number of registered persons with disabilities was recorded in 2019 from the 177 registrants in 2018.

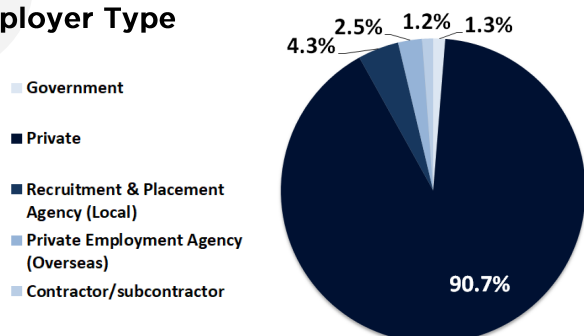

Similar to 2018, majority of the registered establishments were private employers (22,667 or 90.7%) followed by local recruitment and placement agencies (1,086 or 4.3%) and overseas private employment agencies (633 or 2.5%).
